



Principal's Message



"There is no royal road to Utopia," said Camus, and the administration of Flushing High School has realized this through its dealings with students and faculty alike. Problems like truancy and vandalism plague it constantly.

Grade advisers and the program committee are burdened with problems of "personality conflicts" and "equalization," while the "test committee" consisting of Mr. Shapin, Mr. Gray, and Mr. Crystal struggles to review and to return to the students, the results of such major exams as the Regents Scholarship Test, The National Merits and the Scholastic Aptitude Tests. Although situated in an obscure part of the building, the College Room is one of the most oft frequented and oft feared rooms around.

The deans must deal with students directly on matters such as cutting classes, long hair and dress. This year, stricter rules of behavior have been imposed on the students, including the enforcement of a reserved Senior Day, and the shortening of Intersession to six minutes—which change successfully defied the efforts of the entire tobacco industry.

Social Studies



"Click, click, click, click, click, click!" Is it Jiminy Cricket? No! It's the sound of castanets. If you're wondering what castanets have to do with the Foreign Language Department, you've forgotten one of the important aspects of the Program—culture. Don't get the idea that Spanish is one great flamenco. Besides such demonstrative forms of absorbing culture, the language program includes dialogue and audio-visual techniques, and students are taught about the customs and history of the foreign countries where each language is spoken.

In Latin, this is an unusual aspect since the people who originally spoke this language have not been seen for about 1200 years. The French atmosphere is created by contact with the literature of Molière and de Maupassant, and the German program offers exposure to such greats as Goethe and Heine.

Those who take Russian do much more than sing "Volga Boatman" or listen to the strains of "Midnight in Moscow." To supplement the vocal aspects of the course, the students are familiarized with Pushkin's and Turgenev's works.

Although in many schools foreign language means "conjugate" and "decline," in Flushing High School, it also means "see, sing, appreciate and learn."


The Accounting and Law Department also contributes graduates versed in the ways of the business world, teaching the students about stocks and checking accounts in its senior Business Survey classes, for example, and civil law for consumers. The department also offers courses in salesmanship, distributive education, bookkeeping and business machines to the commercial student, thus taking into account a variety of interests and needs.

In sympathy with some students who have studied law, C. Macklin wrote:

Although not strictly vocational in nature, the Industrial Arts Department does include the "shop" courses where students are introduced to subjects requiring a physical dexterity as well as mental alertness. For example, the Metalwork shop is a preparatory course for those wishing to pursue a career in automotive mechanics, or other metalworking trades and the Woodworking shop presents the pupil with an understanding of the fundamentals of carpentry and furniture making. The Electric shop provides a broad program dealing with electronics.

There is also a Pre-Engineering Drawing course, teaching drafting and the related field of architecture, of which a knowledge is necessary to design the sky-scrapers, and homes of the future.





Art Department
